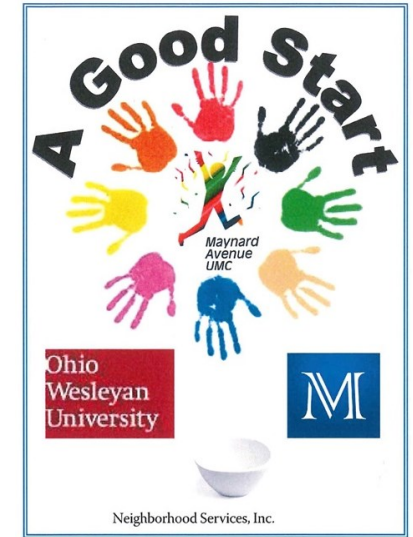

This 6-week literacy rich program is designed to help children adjust to a school atmosphere and learn skills and concepts that will help them succeed in Kindergarten.

With one highly trained teacher for every 6 children, children will become part of a caring, inviting, and safe learning community. Upper Level Education students from Ohio Wesleyan University are hired as teachers.

The program is offered free of charge to eligible families and on a sliding scale for all families. Our goal is to serve those who may not be able to afford other programs.

Enrolled children will receive:

- ❖ Free lunch, snack, school supplies, and backpacks
- ❖ Screening for hearing, speech, and learning differences so that you know what your child needs to do well in school
- ❖ Weekly Family Literacy Workshops with dinner and childcare

What you can expect in our day!

- ❖ Morning Harambee celebrating children, community, and all the strengths they have inside!
- ❖ Literacy rich experience —recognizing and writing letters, learning letter sounds, rhyming
- ❖ Reading and appreciating books — Special Guest Readers; a minimum of 3 read-aloud books each day
- ❖ Learning math and science concepts such as counting, shapes, ecosystems, and life cycles through hands-on learning
- ❖ Expressing ideas through art, music, dance, writing, and drama
- ❖ Learning how to be part of a classroom, eat lunch in a cafeteria, and how to ride a school bus
- ❖ Special opportunities to learn dance, music, martial arts, yoga, science, riding a bike, and gardening.
- ❖ Weekly theme focus on self, family, neighborhood, community/city, country, and world.
- ❖ Increasing expectations within a nurturing environment
